the economic downturn of 2008 to exceed the previous year's fundraising total. The Tocqueville Society, made up of donors giving \$10,000 or more annually, exceeded its goal by more than four percent and raised more than \$4.6 million.

"Every gift is important, and together we will search for solutions to our community's most critical needs," said United Way of Northeast Florida President Connie Hodges. Through the generous support of our donors and community partners, United Way remains focused on our long-term goal – to create sustainable positive change for children and families in our five-county region. We are grateful for the tremendous outpouring of generosity that made this success possible for our community."

Thursday's event also recognized the top supporting companies and organizations in this year's campaign and the organizations and employee campaign chairs that led the way with outstanding results. Other awards presented included New Campaign of the Year, Small Business of the Year, and the Summit Awards.

As the celebration concluded, Terry West, president and CEO of Vystar Credit Union was announced as the 2011 Campaign Chair. West has served for seven years on United Way of Northeast Florida's Campaign Cabinet, is chair of United Way's Strategic Planning "Mobilizing Resources" Sub-Team and serves as member of both the Board of Trustees and Board of Directors.

United Way Salutes Community Champions & Leadership Partners

United Way of Northeast Florida's 2010 results are in – reporting a "turnaround" campaign total of more than \$25 million, up three percent from the previous year, and breaking through the agency's goal of a two percent increase. These strong results will strengthen our community and create lasting change in the lives of children, youth, and families across Northeast Florida. United Way is committed to positive community impact focused on keeping more than 10,000 students on track to high school graduation, helping families achieve financial stability and supporting senior citizens in remaining active and independent.

The grand total of \$25,014,192 was revealed as

More than 500 volunteers and supporting companies gathered for the annual Campaign Leadership and Recognition Celebration on Friday, March 25, 2011, at the Wyndham Riverfront Hotel.

The campaign was led by Scott Brubaker, vice president of operations for the Jacksonville Division of Publix Super Markets, Inc. "We set an inspirational goal for this year's campaign, but one we believed was attainable, said Brubaker. "Because of the generosity of Northeast Florida residents, United Way works every day to move our community and economy forward, by supporting initiatives and programs that prepare children to enter school ready to learn and stay on track to graduation, which increases their chances of earning a living wage or entering college."

United Way leaders congratulated longstanding community partners, award-winning campaigns, and supporters for their hard work, resolve, and commitment. More than 1,000 companies and organizations led campaigns that engaged over 100,000 area residents. Award winners included Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Florida, CSX, Publix Super Markets and Vistakon—all million dollar companies—collectively raising a combined total of more than \$5 million.

"Over the course of our 87 years in Northeast Florida, we've faced many challenges," said United Way's Chairman of the Board, retired Chairman and CEO of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Florida Mike Cascone. The Sherwood Smith Award

The Sherwood H. Smith Children's Champion Award was presented to two outstanding nonprofit professionals for their work on behalf of children and youth. **Deanna "D" Parker, Children's Home Society of Florida, Buckner Division**, received the award for exemplary service, for her work providing after-school homework assistance for elementary-school children who live on campus. Early Childhood Success: Ashton

Quality early-learning develops the building blocks for success in elementary school. Research has shown that children receiving high-quality childcare are more likely to succeed academically, socially and financially later in life. When four-year-old Ashton started at a Success By 6 early learning program last year, he had a difficult time concentrating on tasks and playing with other children. Instead, he would

hide under desks and barely spoke to anyone. Through United Way's Success By 6 program, Ashton's teachers worked one-on-one with him, strengthening his social skills and teaching him how to verbalize questions in class. Today, he is more confident in his interactions with other children and is an active participant in the classroom.

THE CIRCLE OF HONOR recognizes companies and organizations at the level of Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze. At each level there are four criteria, of which two must be met to receive the award.
