A minimum of two of the following criteria must be met for the organization to be considered for this award: gave a corporate gift or matched employee contributions; increased total dollars raised

from previous campaign by 5%; increased percentage of employee participation from previous campaign by 5%; increased number of leadership givers from previous campaign by 5%; increased employee contribution to the community impact fund by 5% or maintained a community impact fund contribution of 80% or higher.

The Sherwood Smith Award

The Sherwood H. Smith Children's Champion Award was presented to two outstanding nonprofit professionals for their work on behalf of children and youth. **Deanna "D" Parker, Children's Home Society of Florida, Buckner Division**, received the award for exemplary service, for her work providing after-school homework assistance for elementary-school children who live on campus. The second award for children's advocacy was presented to **Vicki Burke, founder of PACE Center for Girls**, for her work with at-risk girls.

Named in honor of the late Sherwood H. Smith, a long-time community advocate and former Executive Director of the Jacksonville Community Chest, now United Way of Northeast Florida, each recipient and their organization received a check for \$1,000.

Early Childhood Success: Ashton

Quality early-learning develops the building blocks for success in elementary school. Research has shown that children receiving high-quality childcare are more likely to succeed academically, socially and financially later in life. When four-year-old Ashton started at a Success By 6 early learning program last year, he had a difficult time concentrating on tasks and playing with other children. Instead, he would

hide under desks and barely spoke to anyone. Through United Way's Success By 6 program, Ashton's teachers worked one-on-one with him, strengthening his social skills and teaching him how to verbalize questions in class. Today, he is more confident in his interactions with other children and is an active participant in the classroom.
